Plans for the fall semester include the introduction of a two day Wilson Reading System Overview. The WRS is designed to train tutors to work with struggling readers of all ages. The Overview will be held on two Saturdays, September 15 and 22, 2007, from 8.30 am to 2.30 pm. In the Community Room at Palmer Library.

Future plans include the

introduction of an academic writing program, designed to help students who have gained a GED and would like to prepare to enter community college or a four-year college. The writing program will introduce students to the kind of reading and writing skills that are essential for writing successful college papers. This course will be useful for GED and ESL students.
